



Law Enforcement Appreciation Program of Touro Law Center

The Law Enforcement Appreciation Program of Touro College Jacob D. Fuchsberg Law Center provides police officers with the opportunity to complete their law school education in the recently established five year part-time evening division or four year part-time evening division.

Police officers in the five year program will attend classes three evenings per week in the first year while police officers in the four year evening division will attend classes four evenings per week. Both of these part-time programs were designed with the working student in mind and are ideal for police officers who are employed full-time while attending school. Graduation can be accelerated by taking summer classes.

As a demonstration of Touro Law Center's sincere recognition and gratitude for the protection provided to residents of Suffolk County by police officers in the Suffolk County Police Department, Touro Law Center offers the following incentives:

- A reduced rate LSAT prep course (\$1,500 instead of \$1,850) offered by FOCUS APPROACH for those who have not taken the LSAT. The next course starts Sunday, March 16, and will be held on Touro's campus in Central Islip.
- No Application Fee
- A \$5,000 per year (\$2,500 for fall semester and \$2,500 for spring semester) Law Enforcement Appreciation Scholarship to police officers currently employed by the Suffolk County Police Department who are admitted to the Law Center. Applicants may be eligible for additional merit scholarships.
